Tanja Playner

Austria

Born in Soviet Union and living in Austria, artist Tanja Playner shares optimism and zest for life with her strikingly colorful unique works of art. With her works of art, the artist communicates with people in order to make modern society a little better. She has managed to thrill millions of people with her art. On Twitter follow the artist about 500,000 followers, on facebook about 1,000,000 fans, as also many thousands followers on instagram worldwide. In social media, the artist reaches more than 15 million people a month with her art.

Critics compared her to a mix of Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein and Strokes by Picasso. The British Vogue publishes the artwork "Mona Lisa" by Tanja Playner under Vogue's Masterpiece ... and GQ Magazine publishes the work "Sweet Whisper" in November 2015 alongside Daniel Craig & Monica Belucci and Photograph Ranking with her ranking among the top 300 artists worldwide on artnet. In April 2016 Tanja Playner was listed in the Top 5 Twitter Kings in the Media Magazine in 2nd place. In January 2019 she was listed under the Top internet stars of Austria in one of the biggest newspaper in Austria "Österreich".

Tanja Playner also deals with modern objects, consumer products and people's emotions. She speaks in her art about the way of our society and touches the hearts of the beholder with colorful colors in conjunction with positive emotions. Her motives are not sad emotions, and they are the opposite of cartoons.

Since 2018 Tanja Playner has been experimenting with body plasticity, space and the human sense of self in relation to objects and space. In combination with her already developed style, the artworks often show controversial depictions of the human body to reality.

In contrast to the artist Georg Baselitz, who mainly turns the human body upside down, Tanja Playner places the human body perpendicular to objects. Split upper bodies and lower bodies can often be seen on the artworks, placed perpendicularly, parallel or transversely to one another.

The often split upper and lower bodies are not only placed perpendicularly, parallel or transversely to each other, but also to the landscapes, still lifes and objects. Often the images are presented in combination with abstract, intricate wavy lines that minimize abstract depiction.

The artist's experimental curiosity has continually evolved over the years. In many of her works, she distributes body parts. Tanja Playner develops a new visual language with her fluctuating body parts, bringing them into a new reality. Despite their modern representation, her works appear elegant. The artworks hover between harmony and madness.

With the conspicuousness of her pop art motifs, she reached number 11 in the July 2017 ranking of the top 300 artists worldwide on artnet and stood in front of Damien Hirst, Fernando Botero, Gerhard Richter, Jeff Koons, Yayoi Kusama, Alex Katz, Mr. Brainwash, Takashi Murakami. The artworks of Tanja Playner have been featured in over 50 international exhibitions such as the Antoni Gaudi Modernist Museum in Barcelona, as far as Carrousel du Louvre Paris during the FIAC Art Week 2014 - 2019, Art Basel Miami Art Week 2015, Art Basel Art Week 2019 at the Art Biennale Basel, shown during Cannes Film Festival 2015 - 2019 and Quest Hall Harajuku in Tokyo. The grandson of Ferdinand Porsche Ernst Piech has shown 50 large-format works of Tanja Playner in his museum "FahrTraum" and and also he has art of Tanja Playner in his collection. Also the actress Ornella Muti has the artwork of Tanja Playner in her own.

Tanja Playner is one of the few artists worldwide who was dedicated her own art museum at the age of 32.

Sandy Iseli


Switzerland

Alida Velea was born in a small town, Slanic Prahova. She currently lives and works in Bucharest, Romania.

With a degree in engineering, the decision to transition to the field of fine arts came from a strong inner passion. Thus, a few years later after graduating from the first university, Alida obtained a First Class Honors Degree, in Fine Arts, from the University of Hertfordshire, United Kingdom.

Alida's artistic focus lies in the exploration of one's own cultural identity and its interaction with the personal and social events that shape our lives. Her approach to painting predominantly embodies a figurative style, which she integrates into a cubism with slightly abstract or surrealist notes. She often combines this traditional approach with modern technologies and diverse mediums, resulting in the creation of unique and authentic works of art.

Her works have been included in various exhibitions, both personal and group, including "RENOVART: Inner Colors, 100 artists for the future" at the Naval League - Magna Grecia, Matera, Italy. Last year, in addition to the personal exhibition "Romania Stamp Collection: 1967-1985" in Piacenza, Italy she exhibited both at the Contemporary Art Fair in New York (USA) and at the exhibitions: "The way of seeing the world", Heidenreichstein (Austria), "Art That Unites", Munich (Germany), "Serenade", Madrid (Spain). Upcoming exhibitions include: three group exhibitions in Bucharest (part of the Wanderlust project), the Basel Biennale (Switzerland), Paris Art Fair (France) and a solo exhibition at the Brancovenesti Palaces, Bucharest (Romania).

"I am part of a typology of artists interested in exploring emotions, people, places, and spaces.

My values represent the landmarks according to which I approach a subject that I want to present through my art. They function as an inner compass, and the way of expressing them has developed with my evolution in this field

I constantly translate mental images, related to events and feelings, into different visual forms that carry messages; the used mediums represent a natural way of expressing and illustrating the worlds I perceive. My works tell stories in a figurative style that I integrate into a geometry with abstract or surrealist notes.

The series "Catharsis" (composed of nine works) is dedicated to the women who have lost the loved ones, as a result of the extremely bloody conflicts that are ongoing worldwide (e.g., the war in Ukraine, the war between Israel and Hamas, etc.) and, at the same time, is a tribute to those who are no longer among us.

The work "Catharsis 1" contains a partially erased profile of a woman and a reflection of the same portrait. The death of the loved ones is a hard experience; a mirror breaks and the image is no longer reflected the whole. The feeling of "being" denotes an existence somewhere on the edge of things and an inconsistency of the self.

The series is an inner search, in which the value of forms is not offered only by color, but by their interpretation. The brush stroke of the work follows its geometry and has the role of reveling the feeling, emotion but also the energy of the human being.

The message is completed by the symbolism of the triskelion: a bridge between the earthly realm and the heavenly world, a holistic connection between the physical and the spiritual, but also the idea of accepting the pain and the natural cycle of life".

Rebeccah Klodt is an abstract expressionist from the Twin Cities area of Minnesota, USA. Her art is on display throughout the United States and Europe. She works out of her Minneapolis studio overlooking the Mississippi River, and her lake home as well. Nature, music, and life's majesty are key inspirations for her.

Rebeccah's belief is that the viewer's interpretation of her art is paramount to giving her art meaning. All of her art is untitled to avoid influencing a viewer's response to each painting. Rebeccah enjoys hearing the titles and nicknames people come up with to refer to specific pieces. Leaving the work untitled asks the viewer to engage with her work more deeply and invites them to take part in the artistic process.

Rebeccah is always finding inspiration for new collections while also developing her Soul Work and Line Work. There are no limits for the potential themes, mediums, and materials she may experiment with in the future. Just recently she worked with a sixty-foot canvas roll working with natural elements such as rain, wind, trees, earth, and gravity painting techniques. Art is Rebeccah's favorite mode of expression and she feels that it is an honor to continue to share with the world for years to come.



Through my paintings, I seek to explore the fragility of human nature, the weight of history, and the forces that shape our identities. I work with a muted, often earthy palette, emphasizing contrasts between light and shadow to enhance the psychological tension in my compositions. Figures emerge from darkness, caught in moments of reflection or struggle, inviting the viewer to engage with their stories. I believe that art should challenge, provoke, and inspire; it should not just be seen but felt. Each piece I create is an invitation into a world where beauty and tragedy coexist, where the past echoes into the present, and where silence speaks volumes".

"Hill of power" is a powerful and dramatic painting that portrays the human struggle for power. Inspired by the concept of a "king of the hill" scenario, the artwork explores themes of hierarchy, chaos, and political conflict. The figures are captured in intense motion, their bodies marked by tension and desperation. Through dynamic poses and a composition filled with diagonal lines, the painting conveys a sense of instability and perpetual struggle. The use of warm earthy tones contrasted with cool highlights enhances the emotional intensity of the piece. The lighting, almost theatrical in its presentation, draws focus to the figures and pulls the viewer into a world of conflict and unrest. "Power pile" serves as a metaphor for both individual and collective battles for dominance- a reflection on how ambition and the pursuit of power can lead to destructive outcomes.

In his paintings, Alex Klas draws on Paul Cezanne - the pioneer of classical modernism. In his works, he softens the boundaries of some objects, such as fruit in his still lifes. In a similar way, Gerhard Richter painted the blurriness in his works from the 1960s based on photographs. Alex Klas, however, combines the romantic touch of painting in his works, which is reminiscent of Paul Cézanne, Renoir and the Impressionists, but also approaches abstract painting. Van Gogh discovered sunflowers for himself and associated them with his name in paintings around the world. Alex Klas is also touched by sunflowers and interprets them in his works in different ways: sometimes delicate and fragile and sometimes a little spicy combined with pepperoni. He shows how the artist can still convey the joy of modern painting in his works today, despite the classical perspective.







Karissa Narukami is a Natural-Born Artist from Richmond, BC, Canada, whose intuitive creativity seems without end.

Diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) at a young age, and gifted with topographic memory, for Karissa, the Art is a means of self-expression and communication. Although, it is difficult to get an exact answer to the question about her goals, we can only assume that her main intention in the process of creating her pieces of art is an attempt to establish communication with the outside world, to show others her feelings and sensations.

With no formal art training, Karissa's art speaks volumes. Her art is a visual language, rich in emotion and full of vibrant energy. She has developed a distinctive and raw style, using a unique 'ice-pick' grasp to create dynamic and expressive works, bringing her visions to life. She carefully selects her materials based on how they interact with her senses, she might choose certain brushes because they are soothing to her. She paints in a controlled environment, where she can regulate light, noise, and other factors. These helps her to stay focused and productive.

Karissa creates pieces that explore themes of emotions, identity, and perception. Her art allows her to express the complex ways she interacts with the world, offering viewers a glimpse into her internal landscape. Her pieces are rich in colour, texture, and movement. She works very meticulously with colour and loves small detail. The letters and hieroglyphs of different languages seem to her like magic images. She loves different symbols in ornaments, tries to read them and create her own. She has an amazing imagination which is evident in all her artwork.

Karissa's art pieces have been showcased three times in one-person exhibition in galleries, and numerous times with other local and international artists. She has made public works through 'The Karissa Narukami Autism Foundation', that addresses Free Art Classes for Children & Youth with Autism and other Developmental Disabilities, sponsored a feeding program, and providing art supplies internationally. Recipient of Top Visual Art Award, PWD Champion of Arts, nominated on Excellence Awards in Arts & Culture, Canada. Recognized her artistic achievement Pinacotheque Museum, Luxembourg, Norval Morrisseau Awardee for Visual Arts. She has received broad support for her work from the community, numerous recognitions from Legislative Assembly's, Mayors, and most notably from the Premier of British Columbia.

In a remarkable achievement, Karissa's 2 original art pieces were capsuled and sent to the Moon in The Lunar Codex – a project mission by NASA, forever immortalizing her vision in the vast expanse of space. Codex Minerva was launched in time capsule from Earth to the Moon, landed March 6, 2025 via NASA CLPS-TO-CP11 Mission.

Codex Polaris, carrying 4 of Karissa's artworks called 'The Karissa Narukami Collection' will be launching to the Moon NET Dec 2025 via NASA CLPS-TO-20A Mission.

This honour not only speaks to the uniqueness of her work but also highlights the universal power of art to transcend barriers—whether they be physical, verbal, or even celestial.

Despite the challenges of Autism, Karissa Narukami has found solace and empowerment in her Art, and her pieces are a testament to her resilience, creativity, and individuality. She hopes that her work will inspire others to embrace their unique perspectives and find their own voice.



THE BLUE SARI

This is a painting that encompasses the preservation of history, culture, tradition and a sense of identity in a rapidly changing world. A rich and fascinating tapestry links our past and our present and the diverse influences that have shaped who we are.

The six yard sari is a uniquely Indian garment, with a history that spans millennia. Its graceful drape has adorned Indian women since time immemorial, from the aristocracy to the peasantry. The silk handwoven saris with fine gold and silver weaves or embroidery were a part of every bride's wedding trousseau on the subcontinent.

The adoption of the spinning wheel on the Indian National Flag is symbolic of our long and fascinating textile history. Indian woven fabrics were widely acclaimed in the ancient world, from the Egyptians to the Romans and were sought after in the courts of Medieval Europe reaching a widespread mass appeal in the 17th/18th century with 'Chintz' - hand printed fine cotton in natural dyes and pleasing floral hand block print designs. The iconic Maharani of Jaipur, Gayatri Devi, who had graced the cover of Vogue in the 1960s, wore them with unforgettable grace and style.

The destruction of the Indian handloom industry during the Mughal and Colonial Eras had widespread repercussions, resulting in Gandhi's non violent protests and his encouragement of wearing home spun cotton. The Indian Independence movement led to the boycott of British textiles made with raw materials sent from India

The challenges that confront us in the 21st century regarding this iconic garment is in keeping the culture of its diverse and beautiful regional weaves alive. The handloom industry is already under assault from synthetics and low cost fabrics, resulting in a meager income for the few remaining weavers. The current government has quietly abolished the All India Handloom Board (AIHB)during the pandemic in 2020. A revival of skills and efforts to sustain this heritage is being led by several contemporary designers, working with clusters of weavers to save them from oblivion to keep their precious knowledge and skills alive.

Culture, heritage and fine craftsmanship is a legacy to be passed on to future generations.

GALA Moskvitina

Critics qualify Gala Moskvitina's Art of the Heart as Laternative Realism (derived from Latin words "light" and "nature"). Laternative Realism belongs to Objective Art, defined by a famous philosopher George Gurdjieff in the last century. Objective Art works with the highest, universal tasks that have ever been tackled by humanity. It deals with consciousness, soul, spirit and heart. It is concerned with peace, eternity, immortality, happiness and love.

Gala invented Laternative Realism, she is the only artist in the world who works in this style and there is good reason behind it. She won public acclaim as a graphic artist and book illustrator early in life. Nearly 70 books were published with her illustrations including the complete works of W. Shakespeare and other titles of world classics. But one day she left her glittering career, family and city life and went to the East for 15 long years. There, in distant monasteries of China and ashrams of India, Gala inquired into spiritual meaning of life, her real higher awareness and true power.

Recently she reappeared at the art scene in a different capacity. Now she lavishly shares with the viewers her spiritual findings and discoveries through her artistic works called Lightanghs (the word is derived from «light» and «anchor»). These paintings are peculiar anchors of the soul's light on Earth. Moskvitina's Laternative Realism is dedicated to the inquest of such concepts as Light, Luminance and Luminescence.

Spiritual transformation attained by Gala in the monasteries of the East revealed to her, that the light that people see is only a reflection of the true spiritual Light, of which the whole Universe and all of us are made. And the best thing that can ever happen to a living being is a union with the real life-giving source, the infinite light of awareness.

Moskvitina's paintings have been sold at the biggest auctions of the world, such as Bonhams and MacDougalls. Many are now in private collections, sometimes as meditative pieces. Her art inspires people to uplift their own soul and spirit. In the presence of Gala's Lightanghs a viewer can experience his own light, feel the voice of his own consciousness, understand the power of his own heart. Very few persons in the world have spiritual experiences similar to Gala's, and even fewer of them agree to openly speak about it.

Gala's Laternative Realism is a gift to those who want to develop their potential abilities, contact their true power, and find real love and fullness of being. Her work is not just a harmony of colors created by an artist's masterful hand, but a message of Light, a true Art of the Heart.

Lady of Stone:

"This work refers to the stoning of people. A traditional custom in some countries of the world. In my painting, the stones are broken, as if they were broken by the injustice done to this person and they cannot bear this crime. In a dark and gloomy background, parts of a woman's face with open eyes can be seen among these stones. Eyes that look at people forever..."

Past and Future:

"This work is executed on a background that is collaged with old copies of the Shahnameh book. The Shahnameh book is about the myths and heroes of ancient Iran. Heroes who were humans with very high human qualities. The central image of the work shows a future human being who is somehow digitized and has an identification code and can be controlled by cyberspace. I have tried to make the face of this contemporary human a little like Buddha with eyes that do not see, a tight mouth and ears that do not hear. Buddha achieved enlightenment and awareness with the inner eye, but contemporary man gradually loses his human identity and becomes a robot. His eyes do not see the truth, his ears do not hear the truth and his mouth is incapable of telling the truth. With this current trend, the era of heroes and spiritual humans has ended and this contemporary human being does not reach enlightenment and truth".

Andre Derouin

André Derouin was born in Montreal, where he lived for over 20 years. As a child, he spent every summer exploring the forests and lakes in the Laurentian Mountains. His connection to nature led him to explore and work with wood as a teenager. Over the years, he created numerous original wooden sculptures.

He studied stone carving with Michelle Lavoie and turned to stone carving in 2006. Over time, André Derouin developed his own style.

In 2014, André became a member of the SKÜLPT 303 workshop and in 2015, a member of the Montérégie Stone Carvers Association (ASPM).

Artistic Approach

Nature became his primary source of inspiration. He also explored Native American and Aboriginal artistic creations: sculptures, masks, totems, and monoliths. This also led him to study gargoyles.

In the 1990s, inspired by Native Americans, André began crafting totem poles from dead trees on his land, giving them a second life.

That same year, he discovered a granite quarry near his chalet. The shape, color, and texture of the stones awakened André's passion for sculpture. He began working with stone as a self-taught artist and later completed formal training.

Born in 1978 in Changchun, Jilin Province, China, she moved to Shanghai in 2004.

Yu Qian's artistic career reveals a trajectory of deep exploration into abstract language. After completing her foundational training at the Jilin College of Art, she chose to make specialized breakthroughs at three top art institutions—the oil painting research program at the China Academy of Art deepened her understanding of material expressiveness, the abstract courses at the Central Academy of Fine Arts deconstructed formal logic, and the watercolor studies at the Shanghai Artists Association expanded the boundaries of media. This stepwise academic path shaped her multidimensional creative vision.

The artist transforms auditory synaesthesia into visual rhythm. Music provides not only an inspiration trigger but also forms an invisible set of creative rules—the jumping color blocks in the picture are like chord collisions, and the wandering lines subtly correspond to rhythmic fluctuations. She deliberately preserves the accidental texture when acrylic and oil colors blend, and this "unfinished feeling" appropriately reflects the aesthetics of dynamic balance in nature.

They guide viewers to complete self-projection amidst the interplay of presence and absence, creating a multidimensional spatial illusion on a two-dimensional plane.

The reason her works resonate across cultures is rooted in the artist's capture of primal vitality. The naturally cracked, net-like structures formed by thick layers of paint subtly align with the natural patterns of mountains and rivers or cellular fission. This creative thinking, which merges microscopic and macroscopic perspectives, makes her abstract language both contemporary and a continuation of the Eastern aesthetic genealogy.

Luckily, the opportunity has presented itself after her previous career has changed its course, and she was able to reinvent herself and return to her childhood desire to become an artist.

She feels extremely grateful to have the chance to discover, explore, enjoy and share her passions and creations in color, texture, form and scale with the world at large.

In the 80s, Susane Hessenthaler met the photographer Hubert Gloss, who wanted to photograph her. She spontaneously felt like painting herself for this purpose. This developed into a collaboration that lasted several years. Exhibitions of her body painting photos turned into painting events in front of an audience, then into performing art. They split up and Susanne continued working alone. She continued painting on canvas and experimented with camouflage. This was followed by some work for the theater, such as stage design assistance and costume painting for the Bregenz Festival.

Susanne Hesenthaler's grandmother also painted and introduced her to art.

As a teenager, Susanne was strongly influenced by Salvador Dali and the whole of surrealism. She was also inspired by an exhibition about Frida Kahlo in the 80s. The basis for her current work was Judy Chicago's "Dinner Table". There, typically female techniques such as sewing and ceramics are declared art and thus taken out of the "handicraft corner".

When Susanne started, she wanted to feel alive and bring hidden feelings to the surface. As she gets older, other themes naturally dominate her work. The question of how to live well and meaningfully. The happiness of pursuing an activity that is not determined by others (Erich Fromm). Religious questions. Death and grief play a role. Interest in political processes increases.

Susanne Hessenthaler was inspired by Judy Chicago's "Dinner Table", a deeply feminist work. In her 20s, she was interested in feminist literature. Alice Schwarzer taught Susane that she was allowed to have her own experiences and that feminism means personal responsibility and making her own decisions. Authors such as Simone de Beauvoir and Christine Brückner also influenced Susanne Hessenthaler.

Fabric is the main material for her installations. Her latest installation, "Job," also uses wood and metal. She works on an installation for at least a year.

"Job" reflects her fascination with the Mexican cult of the dead. The influence of the Comedia del Arte and carnival is also present. The masks are meant to drive away evil spirits. However, a divine principle exists, represented by a disk that floats in space.

The bones and teeth symbolize the fear of death.

In the Carrousel du Louvre she exhibited the installation "Judith and Holofernes":

"A theme that has been treated in many different ways in art and literature. I was inspired by Artemisia Gentileschi's depiction in Rome. It is a symbolic legend that describes the Israelites' conflicts with other great empires (e.g. the Babylonians). Judith's city is besieged by Holofernes. She beheads him through a ruse. She invites him to her place, gets him drunk and when he falls asleep, she cuts off his head. The story is complex. On the one hand, women can see in it a heroine who saves herself and perhaps even others in times of danger. On the other hand, the legend can be applied to the present day. Unfortunately, we are in acute danger of war."


Tomas Lagūnavičius is based in Kaunas, Lithuania. He is a multi-disciplinary, mixed-media artist and his art has always been a manifestation of his vision of the world. His creative work includes visual and performing arts. Tomas Lagūnavičius has organized over 37 solo exhibitions, staged over 50 performances, participated in 56 international exhibitions and biennales, such as the 13th Florence Biennale (Florence, Italy, 2021), the Earth Art Exhibition "Balance" (Vilnius, Lithuania, 2021). Tomas' art has been recognized all over the world. His art has been included in the 15th Annual Art Exhibition "Abstracts" (USA) in which he won fifth place and in a virtual exhibition in Brussels, Belgium organized by the V-Art Union. Also, Tomas has been a winner in several contests. His artworks won first and fifth place in "The Spring Countdown Show" at "Gallery Ring" (Toronto, Canada). He also won a second place at the annual "Animal Kingdom "competition organized by "Fusion Art" (Santa Fe, New Mexico), third place at a virtual exhibition "Light of Love" (Beijing, China) and a platinum award at "Abstracts" exhibition organized by "J Mane Gallery" (New Jersey, USA). Tomas has performed with "Dead Soldier's Dance" in Brussels, Belgium during Crude Saturdays and in Venice, Italy during "Contemporary Venice" festival. His last solo exhibition was in Berlin, Germany.

The artist regularly exhibits his paintings in various galleries in different countries: the Boomer Gallery (London, England), Artly Mix Gallery (São Paulo, Brazil), Artio Gallery (Toronto, Canada), Collect Art (CoA) Gallery (Tbilisi, Sakhkartveli, Sakartveli).

Tomas Lagunavicius is an interdisciplinary artist who specializes in digital and performance art. His vision is meta-conceptualism. For him it is important to create a concept first then represent it. Since 2006 he has been creating visual art objects such as installations, paintings, photographs, digital art and so on.

Tomas considers himself a post-matrix person. A post-matrix person is a person who has many selves. He does not try to suppress any of his selves. For example, he may be a painter and he may be a psychologist and he may be a marketer. All of them need to be given time, space and energy to excel in their fields. There is no contradiction between them and there may be no connection. They can exist side by side at the same time. The rational self of the marketer may have nothing to do with the sentimental self of the writer.

Tomas uses over 200 creative techniques. Different techniques are used in different types of art. He distinguishes between visual arts, performing arts and textual arts. When he first starts he thinks about what he would like to say or hide in his artwork, then he uses different creative techniques to find the best solution and then he puts it into practice.

Non-binary, Brooklyn-based visual artist Naomi Friedman works through the mediums of collage and mixed media art. Friedman graduated Cum Laude from Vassar College in 2022 and co-founded the Boyz With Apple artist collective the same year. Friedman is currently in residence with the Arquetopia Honors Lab, and exhibits work globally. exhibitions Recent "Interconnecting Lines" with ARTIO gallery in New York; RedDot Miami during Basel Miami 2024; and participation in the Flyer Art Tour of Milan, Rome, and Florence. They were a recipient of the 2024 International Prize Botticelli for Artistic Merit and, more recently, have been nominated for the 2025 Artist of the Year award—curated by Dr. Salvatore Russo and Dr. Francesco Russo at the Effeto Arte Foundation in Florence.

In their practice, Friedman explores the line between space and place—using repetition and pattern to play with scale. In the same way that to achieve trans gender euphoria, and non-binary identity specifically, demands a courageous reconfiguration—growing, stretching, reaching, and letting go—of our sense of self, collage allows for the fantastical reimagination of seemingly mundane, disconnected images. In Friedman's work, emergent reimagination defies gravity, bending the laws of space and time in order to prevailing binaries in society: auestion reason/nature, male/female, guilty/innocent, good/evil.


Mitsuhiro Higuchi

At the age 6, Nasim was adopted from a Kazakh Orphanage to Hamburg Germany under the adoptive name Natalia Blatz. She now publishes her art under her birth name NASIM.

The artist draws a lot of muse from her path of finding her own identity. Nasim claims that ever since she's been a little girl she sees the world through colors. Along with socially reflective statements and loud colors, her art aims to create a sense of sensuality and excitement.

In her artwork she uses many different layers, each using different techniques and sometimes materials. Nasim has been painting abstract since 2016 and then found herself in a modern realistic style from 2022. She prefers to express herself on large canvas and uses acrylic, neon acrylic and spray paint.

Nasim's abstract works of art bear the influence of Gerhard Richter's techniques. The colors are applied in layers and set in motion with a palette knife. However, in several works the artist goes her own way and experiments with movement.

At times these are reminiscent of geometric objects and at other times they create a certain dialogue with the works of Rothko. The artist also incorporates expressions into her work. Lines are used. In connection with the background and the color scheme of the lines, the work is reminiscent of the forest with its depth. It is like a web, the contrast of the colors that the artist uses. Red and blue lines create a strong contrast and a dialogue in the search for questions and answers. The lines, which in a certain way symbolically recall the cross and the sun at the same time, can also be found in the work "Marta." This work is kept in subtle and sensitive colors. In her work "Lili Grab," the artist uses colors that reflect her closeness to nature. Earthy tones are overlaid with sky blue. A contrasting red color suddenly appears, adding an accent to the artwork. Experimentation accompanies NASIM in her work and is the driving force in the creation of her works of art.
